Chairman Jones called the meeting to order at 8:00p.m. She read the Ethics and Conflict of Interest reminder. Jennifer Morris indicated a possible conflict since she submitted the laser CEU approval request, which will be considered tonight.

Approval of Minutes

On a motion from McCullough, seconded by Poole, the minutes of the June 1, 2018 meeting were approved as corrected.

Laser CEU Request

Dr. Kundaria discussed an offering of courses, which was previously approved for 8 hrs. The course has now been submitted for approval of an additional 2 hours. Dr. Kundaria has received a listing of the topics proposed to be covered. He has not received a course description, though the content appears to be o.k. There are also no time frames listed for the topics. The organization's website offers no additional information. Dr. Kundaria wanted to ensure out of scope laser topics are not included in the 10 hour offering. The Board voted to approve the course provided the required information regarding course objective, timeframes, and the application form are submitted, as required by our rules. Ronda reminded the Board that it can rescind previously approved coursework if information is discovered at a later date which would have caused disapproval had the information been available at the time of approval.

Merger Update

Jones reported that it appears the merger with the Barber Board is off the table for this year. It has been an up and down battle for the past two weeks; however, the time devoted by the Legislature to consider public bills has ended. The session will last two more weeks, but it is very doubtful our bill can be resurrected.
